





Space Explorers

This summer, campers (2016 birth year) will take a trip into outer space! Using a playful and creative lens, campers will explore all that our solar system has to offer, and dig deeper into the wonder of the sun, moon, and stars! Children will also be treated to a daily dose of unstructured gross motor time on our spacious rooftop playground, and visits to our community garden, and sprinkler setup!

A Typical Day

Every group's schedule will be unique, but each will include several fundamental components, including unstructured playtime, teacher-led activities, built in family-style meal times, enrichments, such as Music, Mad Science, and Hip Hop, and ample time outdoors. Below is a sample schedule for a group of full day 3-year olds.

Session 1: Planets

June 24th – July 3rd

Our first camp session will serve as an introduction to the solar system. Through a myriad of art, sensory, and science explorations, campers will learn about the 9 planets, focusing predominantly on earth and all our great planet has to offer! Campers will also engage in a variety of investigations that will serve to deepen their understanding gravity, the incredible force that keeps our solar system in balance!

Session 2: Stars

July 8th – July 12th

Through explorations of light and shadow, campers will learn about the composition of our night sky. Campers will use an artistic lens to investigate the function of stars, and the tools necessary to view them.

Session 3: Moon

July 15th – July 19th

Deepening their explorations of light and shadow from Session 2, in Session 3 campers will dig deeper into the darkness of our nights on earth and the light the moon provides for us. This session will include an introduction in the phases of the moon and its path around the earth.

Session 4: Space Travel

July 22nd – July 26th

During this session campers will make most of their imagination as they explore the idea of space travel! Counselors will guide the campers through investigations of rocket ships and other space exploration vehicles, and begin to dig deeper into what it means to be an astronaut? What do they do? How do they do it?

Session 5: SUN

July 29th – August 2nd

During this session, campers will make the most of our rooftop terrace by using the abundance of sunlight to develop an understanding of the giant star that lights our earth. Using a variety of methods and tools, campers will engage in art and science investigations that extend their understanding of sunlight and the colors within it!

Incoming 2s Transition Class

9:00 am - 11:00 am, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays

Our innovative transition class is specifically designed for children enrolled in our school for the Fall of 2019 (exclusively for children born in 2017). Our tailored approach focuses on the process of separation between child and caregiver in order to best prepare children for their first group experience away from home. Caregivers will therefore join their child for the start of the summer, and work together with their child's teachers to gradually lead their child toward independence at school.

A parent or caregiver is required to stay with their child for the first 2 weeks of camps. After this time the parent/caregiver will slowly transition out of the classroom, as led by the class instructor and in direct response to the needs of the specific group. Children in this group will be also be offered enrichment activities in their classroom weekly.

Transition Camp is only open to incoming WNS families and must commit all sessions to ensure the success for the fall.

Refund/Cancellation Policy

Up to 14 days before the session start date, you will receive a full refund (minus the non refundable registration fee). 7 days prior to the start date you will receive a 50% refund (minus the non refundable registration fee). 24 hours prior to the start date there is no refund.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can I leave my stroller at school when I drop off my child?

Yes! We have a designated a Stroller Parking Area in the back stairwell of our building where you are more than welcome to store your strollers, scooters, and helmets for the day. However, please keep in mind that only umbrella-style folding strollers will be permitted in the stroller storage area. Any and all strollers kept here must be folded and hung at all times. This area is an emergency exit and we need your help to keep the walkway clear and safe for all children, families, and staff.

Will my child's lunch be stored in a refrigerator during the day?

Yes! Lunches will be stored in our community refrigerators located in the kitchen. Refrigerator shelves will be labeled by class name, and lunches will be brought upstairs to the classroom by the child's teacher. Lunches that require reheating will be warmed in the microwave.

Where do I drop-off/pickup my child?

All campers will be dropped off and picked up in their own classroom.

What is the walking procedure around the neighborhood?

Campers at the preschool are fortunate enough to have their own rooftop playground, which makes getting plenty of sunshine and fresh air easy. Due to this setup, classes will not travel outside of the building unless a special trip is planned in advance and extra counselors are available for assistance.

Does my child have to be potty-trained?

If my child is not potty-trained, do I have to supply diapers?

No! Campers at the preschool do not need to be potty-trained prior to beginning camp. Additionally, diapers and wipes are provided by our school, but you can of course choose to bring in your own if you prefer.



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
